From: UAA Faculty Senate Resolution on Enrollment Management

On February 13, 2003, the Faculty Senate approved the following resolution following management's proposal forwarded by the Faculty Executive Board:

**WHEREAS** decisions on enrollment management have increasingly centralized away from departments and toward administrative offices; and

**WHEREAS** department faculty have not been consulted for their expertise in courses and programs relevant to effective enrollment management; and

**WHEREAS** many enrollment management decisions are made exclusively by administrators with little consultation with faculty; and

**WHEREAS** the impact of enrollment management on curriculum and instruction is significant; and

**WHEREAS** faculty teaching cancellations are being used as an alternative teaching assignment with very little preparation;

**WHEREAS** student learning and retention are being curtailed by a lack of faculty involvement in decisions about which classes to offer each semester; and

**WHEREAS** students are confused by the cancellation of classes at the last minute; and

**WHEREAS** students' frustration with enrollment management, thus making the enrollment problem worse, is not being addressed;

**WHEREAS** faculty morale, retention, and knowledge that they have a voice concerning enrollment decisions are being impacted by the lack of faculty involvement in enrollment management decisions; and
